# Classroom Cell Phone Policy



 **NO CELL PHONES ALLOWED IN SCHOOL** 

## It's the Law!

To ensure a focused learning environment and comply with state/school policy, all cell phones are **strictly prohibited** from being used during school hours.

## Where Do Cell Phones Go?

All cell phones **must be stored inside your bookbags** from the moment you enter school grounds until the final bell rings. Cell phones cannot be in your pockets.

## No Exceptions

Students are **not permitted to use their cellphones** at any time while on school property. This includes hallways, classrooms, and the cafeteria. If you need to call your parents, go to the Main Office or Student Services.


- **CONSEQUENCES:** Failure to adhere to this policy will result in student's cell phone or electronic device being confiscated by administrators, staff, or teachers. Depending on the offense, devices will either be returned by an administrator back to the student at dismissal (3:50p.m.) or a parent/guardian will need to pick up the device in the main office.

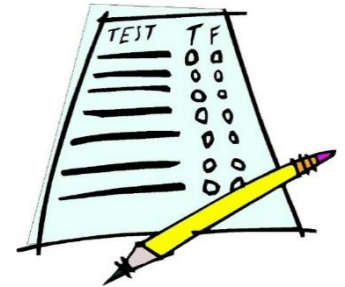

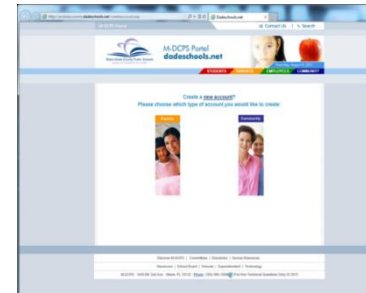

- ✖ M/J Language Arts Through ESOL is a required course for all ELs. ELs scoring at Levels 1 and 2 on the most recent administration of the statewide, standardized ELA assessment are to be enrolled in a second ESOL course, M/J Developmental Language Through ESOL course.
- ▲ Students are required to complete one course of the District and State Approved courses which incorporates career and education planning and includes the development of a personalized academic and career plan. This promotion requirement is to be completed in grade 6, 7 or 8.
